MINUTES

Wednesday Morning

The eighty-sixth annual meeting of the Shiawassee Baptist Association was called to order by the Moderator, Rev. C. W. Kemper, at 10:30 A. M., June 8, 1921, at Ovid Baptist Church.

Rev. G. Woolcock, of Ovid, conducted a devotional service, after which the Moderator appointed the following committee on Nominations:

Rev. E. E. Burdick.

The Program Committee submitted a printed program and asked for its acceptance. The same was voted, subject to any necessary changes.

The Pastor of the entertaining Church read the Church's letter and supplemented it with a short talk in which a most hearty welcome was extended to the visitors and delegates. This was followed by the reading of the letters from the Churches, a digest of which will be found on another page.

The Treasurer's report was read and adopted.

Rev. A. P. McDonald and Rev. F. L. Currey were introduced to the Association and responded with reminiscenses of an earlier period when both were active in the work of this Association.

Wednesday Afternoon

1:00 Rev. A. M. Bailey conducted a very helpful devotional service.

Women's Session No. 1.

1:45 The first of two Women's Sessions opened with the Vice-president, Mrs. H. H. Allen, in the chair.

The Basket Meeting held in the First Church, Lansing, in May, was fully reported, and other matters of business attended to, after which the Ovid Circle entertained the Session with a play entitled "How Not To Do

It." How not to run a Missionary Meeting was graphically and laughably set forth.

2:45 Rev. D. T. Grey, of Olivet Church, Lansing, gave an interesting address on "Associational Progress."

The Nominating Committee submitted their report and the same was adopted as indicated in the Directory.

The Ordination Committee of last year reported the investigation and subsequent ordination of two young men to the Baptist Ministry: Brother L. A. Meade, of Grand Ledge, and Brother J. H. Stevens, of Hart and Pentwater, the former ordination occurring at Grand Ledge and the latter at Owosso.

3:30 The Annual Sermon was preached by Rev. W. T. Woodhouse of Corunna. This inspiring, cheering message brought to a close an interesting afternoon program.

Wednesday Evening

- 7:00 The evening service opened with a rousing song-service directed by Rev. L. A. Meade. Brother Meade also conducted devotionals.
- 7:30 An audience that taxed the capacity of the church heard, with keenest interest, the two addresses of the evening; the first by Rev. F. L. Currey, our Director of Evangelism, on the subject—"The Ideals of Evangelism" and the second by Dr. C. H. Barlow, one of our esteemed medical missionaries, on "Christ in China."

Thursday Morning

- 9:00 Rev. F. D. Hague, of Okemos, conducting the devotional service gave a most helpful exposition of Rev. 2:1-7, in which he dwelt upon the Christian's debt of love to Jesus.
- 9:30 The rest of the morning was taken up with the presentation and discussion of various Church Standards of work as follows:—

Sunday School and B. Y. P. U. Standards were ably presented by Dr. C. H. Berry, Director of the Department of Religious Education.

Various suggestions on "The Local Church's Yearly Program" were made by Rev. E. E. Burdick of Lansing.

"Local Church Finances" was the subject assigned Rev. L. A. Fisher of Elsie, while "Association Standards" was presented by Rev. G. S. Northrup of DeWitt.

Thursday Afternoon

- 1:15 Rev. F. C. Fistler, of St. Johns, conducted a devotional service which included an instructive exposition of Rev. 2:8-11.
- 1:40 A letter from the Fowlerville Church, requesting membership in the Shiawassee Association, was read and the request unanimously granted. Moderator Waite, in a few well-chosen words, welcomed the Fowlerville Church into the fellowship and work of the Association and extended the hand of fellowship to their Pastor, Rev. W. C. Roof.

Women's Session No. 2

1:45 Following the appointment of a nominating committee and some routine business, Miss Florence E. Grant, of Birmingham, gave some delightful reminiscenses of a recent trip to Porto Rico. Miss Grant also spoke earnestly of the task assigned to her to lead the Baptist women of Michigan in raising one hundred thousand dollars for the building of a Girls' Dormitory at Kalamazoo College.

Miss Grant was followed by Miss Lydia Huber, a missionary of the W. A. B. H. M. Society, whose labors had been in Porto Rico, the land of little people and big opportunities. Miss Huber's address touched the hearts of all as it revealed the genuine Christian spirit in which her work was done.

Then Mrs. Dr. Barlow was introduced and in response made a soul-stirring plea for greater unity among Michigan Baptists and for a more adventurous faith in reference to our Missionary tasks.

The session was concluded with a selection by the Ladies' Quartet of the Ovid Church.

2:45 George Lawrence, Director of the Department of Rural Churches, spoke on "The Awakening of the Rural Church;" a vital topic handled in a practical way.

3:30 The report of the Committee on Resolutions

^{3:15} Following the reading of a letter from the South Lansing Church to the Clerk of the Association a spirited discussion took place with regard to the general desire to heal the breach between the South Lansing Church and the Association. It was finally decided by an unanimous vote that all records of the South Lansing Church matter of a year ago should be expunged from the Minutes of the Association of 1920—1921, and that the Pastor, Rev. C H. Heaton and the members of the South Lansing Church be assured that it is the desire of the Shiawassee Baptist Association to fellowship with them and to work unitedly for the healing of all former and present unpleasantnesses.

was read and adopted as follows:—"Whereas the work in which the Churches of this Association are engaged for the purpose of building up the Master's kingdom at home and abroad centers in the program of the New World Movement of the Northern Baptist Convention, therefore Be it resolved that we commit ourselves to carrying out its plans of financial and evangelistic effort, and urge upon each Church that in loyalty to Christ it can do no less than to carry out that portion of the program that is alloted to the local field.

"As our Governor is in sympathy with efforts for the advancement in our State of a better moral life, and of respect for law and order, Be it resolved that we deplore the lax situation with reference to gambling, Sabbath desecration and the illegal traffic in intoxicating liquors.

"Be is also resolved that we call the Governor's attention to these evils and pledge the hearty cooperation of all our people in eradicating them from our State.

"Be it resolved that we express our hearty appreciation of the cordial hospitality of the people of Ovid, and of the splendid way the Ovid Church and Pastor have entertained this Association.

"Be it further resolved that we express to our State Superintendent, Grant M. Hudson, and his family, our love and sympathy in their great bereavement which they have experienced in the loss of their beloved wife and mother. Mildred Hudson.

3:15 The closing address of the Association was given by Rev. H. A. Waite. It was a masterful presentation of the subject of Christian Stewardship.

The registration clerk announced a total enrollment

of 115 delegates and visitors from outside of Ovid.

A touching scene was enacted in the closing moments of the Association when the Moderator called upon all to join hands in one large circle inclosing our beloved missionaries, Dr. and Mrs. C. H. Barlow. "Blest Be the Tie That Binds," was sung, followed by a closing prayer and benediction, after which refreshments were served to all who tarried.

Perry—Pastor Curtis gaining affections of Church and community.

Lansing, North—Daily Vacation Bible School held. Intermediate and Junior B. Y. P. U. and Boy Scouts organized. Sunday School and Prayer-Meeting growing.

Owosso—Decision Day brought in fine class of teenage boys and girls, also some adults. Missionary vision enlarged. Property improved. Thirty-three baptisms.

Okemos—Evangelistic campaign resulted in twentyfour baptisms. Tithing Campaign followed by organization of League with forty members.

Haslett—Ten batized and twelve tithers.

DeWitt—Building enlarged. S. S. and Women's Missionary Society doing good work.

Corunna—Property improved. Finances good. Outlook encouraging.

Byron—Congregations increasing. Prayer-meetings well attended.

Durand—Very good year. Twenty baptisms. Numerous improvements to property. Mission Circle planning to educate Chinese student.

Lansing, First—Emphasis on evangelism blessed. Ideal site for Community House purchased. S. S. and B. Y. P. U. in prosperous condition.

Laingsburg—Raised more money for current expenses and missions than in several years.

Elsie—One organized adult class numbers eighty members. Attendance increasing and conversions occurring.

Vernon—Cradle Roll established. S. S. increased. All departments doing fine.

Ovid—Twenty-three conversions during year. Property painted and redecorated. New World Movement pledges being promptly paid.

Fowlerville—B. Y. P. U. organized. Planning to enlarge and equip basement. Outlook good.

Bath—Still on the job and looking for a leader.

Rose—Sent seven delegates and Pastor, but no written greetings.

Lansing, Olivet—Beautiful sectional building erected on fine site, thru help of State Convention, City Union and First Church. Many conversions. S. S. tripled. Senior and Junior B. Y. P. U. and Boy Scouts organized. Great outlook.

Williamston—No settled Pastor. E. E. Burdick supplying faithfully.

Grand Ledge—A wonderful year. Fifty-one baptisms. Congregations large. Baracca and Philathea Classes and B. Y. P. U. all on the firing line for Christ. Enlargement of property contemplated.

Antrim—No Pastor. Pulpit supplied. S. S. and B. Y. P. U. at work. Eight baptisms during year.
