LAUREL COUNTY, KY., Oct. 1875.

The delegates from the several churches composing the Laurel River Assocition of United Baptists, convened with the church at Rough Creek Meeting House, on Friday before the first caturalay in October, 1875.

Eld. W. B. Estes delivered the annual sermon from St. Luke 19th chap.

and 13th verse.

Eld. Hiram Johnson, moderator of ast session, being present, called the association to order, and Eld. J. W. Moren, clerk of the last session, being present, proceeded to enroll delegates' names and record the statistics of the several churches, which are shown in the table of statistics.

The association being thus organized proceeded to ballot for moderator and elerk, whereupon Eld. Hiram Johnson was chosen as moderator and Eld.

J. W. Moren, clerk.

1st. The privilege was extended for he reception of churches into the assocition; two letters were presented, one from the church at Island creek, Clay county, and one from the church at Mt. Ararat, Knox county, both of which was received and their messengers in-

vited to seats. 2nd. Corresponding letters were called for, whereupon the following letters were handed in: From Lynn Camp, by her Messengers, E. R. Jones, R. H. Perry, J. Umphlete, J. Helton, and Elders G. Proffit, H. D. Harmon, E. H. Revel, W. Tye, and J. B. Lewis. Their statistics are : baptised 154, total From North Concord, by her 1089. nessenger, J. N. Maddock; their statistics are: baptised 77, total 1043.— From Rockcastle, by her messengers, Elds. W. T. Reynolds and J. B. Abpott; their statistics are: baptised 92, total 1044. From Redbird, by her messenger, Eld. Z. Sutton; their statistics re: baptized 2, total 132. Cumberland River, messenger, J. S. Reynolds, but 10 letter; their statistics are: baptised 2. total 1400. Boonville, no letter, but nessenger Eld. R. G. Murray.

3rd. Ordered, That we invite all visting brethren to seats with us, whereapon, Eld. R. S. Taylor, from South District Association, reported and ac-

epted the invitation.

4th. Ordered, That we hold our next innual meeting with the church at Mt. Pleasant meeting house, Lanrel couny, on Friday before the 1st Saturday in October, 1876.

5th. Ordered, That brethren, D. R. Brock, G. Weaver and B. F. Johnson, be a committee on correspondence.

6th. Ordered, That brethren W. B. Estes, Joseph Weaver and W. Brock, be a committee to answer a query coming from the church at Mt. Pleasant.

7th. Ordered, That the delegation from the church at Rough Creek, be a

committee on Divine services.

8th. Ordered, That brethren, J. Mason, W. V. Fisher and Wm. McCarty, with the moderator and clerk, be a committee on arrangements.

9th. Ordered, That we adjourn till 9

o'clock to-morrow morning.

SATURDAY MORNING, 9 o'clock. The association met pursuant to adjournment; prayer by Eld. A. Whitt.

1st. Report of committee on arrangements, read, adopted and committee discharged.

2nd. Committee on Divine services report that Elders W. T. Reynolds, J. Abbott, J. B. Lewis and E. Williams, preach to-day—to night, J. Abbott and J. S. Reynolds—and on Sunday, H. D. Harmon, R. S. Taylor, preach, and moderator close, or select some one to close.

3rd. Letters to corresponding association called for, read and adopted, and the following brethren to bear them:— To Rockeastle, W Adams and Elds. B. F. Catching, W. C. Barret, A. Whitt, A. B. Belvin. Their next association to be held with the church at Sinking Valley, Pulaski county, beginning on Friday before the 4th Saturday in September, 1876. To Boonville, Elds. 6th. Report of Evangelist called for, and the following report was handed

DEAR BRETHREN: As your Evangelist for the past year, I respectfully submit the following report to the consideration of your body: Spent in the work 145 days; travelled about 1075 miles; delivered 164 sermons and exhortations; witnessed 90 accessions to the church; assisted in the ordination of one minister and one deacon; received as a donation from the associawhen associated \$14.75 cents; received from the church at Slate Lick, \$7 70 cents; from the church at Mt. Pleasant, \$13 30 cents; from other contributors \$17.80 cents; making in the whole \$52 85 cents. [A collection when the report was made, raised the sum to \$71 50.7

9th. This Association advises churches in her Union, to meet at the respective nieeting houses on the 4 day of May, 1876, and in their ow way, to celebrate the Centennial of the Baptists in Kentucky.

10. Ordered, That brethren W. Estis, Levi Johnston and D. William

be a committee on finance.

11th. Ordered, That the clerk supe intend the printing of the minutes an distribute the same among the churche according to number; also, that w have 700 copies printed.

12th. Ordered, That the clerk hay any money that be left after the ex pense of printing is defrayed, as a re

muneration for his services.

13th. On motion of Eld. G. Brock it is ordered that brother Joseph Weav er, be appointed to write a history of the rise and progress of the church a Providence, to be placed on record in the association book.

14th Resolution-No. 1.-Resolved That we request the Irvine association to take into notice the condition of

Pleasant Run church.

Resolved 2nd, That the clerk have ap pended to the minutes the form o Letter to the association, and the church es be requested to conform thereto.

Resolved, 3d, That we tender ir thanks to the moderator and That clerk for their faithful and impartial services; also, to the brethren, sisters and friends in the vicinity, who have with such christian friendship and hospitality, entertained us during our present session.

15th. Ordered, That we adjourn until our next association in course.
