MINUTES.

FIRST DAY.

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 6, 1876.

The Laurel River Association of United Baptists met pursuant to adjournment, with the Mt. Pleasant Church, Laurel county, Ky., October 6, 1876.

The Introductory Sermon was delivered by Elder J. W. Moren,

from Matthew 28: 19, 20.

The Association was then called to order by the Moderator of

the last session, Elder Hiram Johnson.

On motion, all visiting brethren were invited to seats in the body. Elder Enoch Wakefield, from Franklin Association, reported. On motion,

Resolved, That our next annual meeting be held with the church at Horse Creek, on Friday before the first Saturday in October, 1877.

Two letters having been presented from Liberty Church, each claiming to be the church, it was, on motion,

Resolved. That a committee of our visiting brethren be appointed to hear and determine the difficulty, and report to-morrow morning.

Br'n. N. B. Johnson, N. B. Creekmore, J. J. Edwards, Z. Sutton, were named as the committee.

Resolved, That Elders A. B. Belvin and S. C. Jackson be permitted to conduct the investigation.

On motion, Br'n. J. F. Weaver, Jas. Harkleroad, and C. W. Jones were appointed a committee on correspondence.

On motion, the delegation of the Mt. Pleasant Church be a com-

mittee on divine services.

On motion, Br'n. Jos. Weaver, W. B. Estes, and Joel Philpot were appointed a committee on queries coming from Mt. Pleasant and Rough Creek churches.

On motion, Br'n. F. Lincks, J. F. Weaver and Thos. McCracken, with the Moderator and Clerk, were appointed a committee on ar-

rangements.

On motion, adjourned until to-morrow morning at 9 o'clock.

SECOND DAY.

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 7, 1876.

The Association met pursuant to adjournment; prayer by Elder A. P. Smith.

Report of committee on arrangements called for, read, adopted,

and committee discharged.

Committee on divine services report that Elders Z. Sutton and J. J. Edwards preach in the forenoon to-day; and in afternoon, N. B. Johnson and Philip Foley. At night, at the meeting-house, Elders N. B. Creekmore and Philip Foley. On Sunday, Elders Z. Sutton, N. B. Johnson, and the Moderator.

Report of committee on correspondence called for, read, adopted, and committee discharged. The following brethren appointed to

bear letters to corresponding Associations, viz:

Answer—Your committee would say, in regard to discipline, that members of the Church, who publicly sin and violate God's laws, should be held to a public acknowledgement to the Church, to God, and to the community, or be cut off.

Answer—Your committee would say that it is certainly not right for church members to engage in the manufacture, sale, or use, as a beverage, of ardent spirits; that members so engaged should certainly be dealt with by the Church.

The report of the Evangelist of the Association was called for and presented as follows:

To the Ministers and Messengers composing the Laurel River Association of United Baptists:

Dear Brethren—As your evangelist for the past year, I respectfully wish to submit the following report for the consideration of this body: Spent in the work 120 days, traveled about 1,230 miles, delivered 135 sermons and exhortations, witnessed 47 accessions to the Church, assisted in the ordination of one minister and in the constitution of one church; received from the brethren at Mt. Pleasant, \$9.75; from other contributors, \$4.35—making in the whole \$14.10. I remain yours in Christ, to labor in the gospel,

J. W. MOREN, Evangelist.

In answer to a question by committee of arrangements, viz: Shall we appoint an Evangelist? the Association answers in the

negative, the vote standing 21 for to 48 against.

The report from Bro. Joseph Weaver, (who was appointed by the last meeting of this body to collect certain historical facts concerning the rise and progress of the church at Providence), called for, read and adopted, and ordered to be appended to the Minutes as follows:

The church at Providence was constituted with nineteen members, on the 23d day of May, 1819, and since then has ordained eight ministers, and constituted seven churches, viz: Rockcastle, London, (now Slate Hill), Rough Creek, Robertson's Creek, Little Goose, Walnut Grove, and New Bethel.

The churches were all requested to meet at Providence, on the first Satur-

day in October, 1831, in conference, to organize an Association.

The committee appointed to hear and determine the difficulty existing in the church at Liberty, submitted the following report:

The committee organized by appointing Elder N. B. Johnson, chairman, and N. B. Creekmore, secretary. Letters from both parties were then read, and, after hearing the evidence, your committee decide that both parties are in disorder, and recommend that the parties unite upon some disinterested minister as their pastor, and wipe out all their records from February, 1876, to the present time, and become one people, and work for Christ in the future.

The report was adopted, and committee discharged.

On motion, Elder W. B. Estes was appointed to preach the next annual sermon, Elder Hiram Johnson his alternate.

Ordered that Br'n. C. W. Jones, George Cole, and G. W. Cook be appointed a committee on finance.

Resolved, That the brother Clerk superintend the printing and distribution of the Minutes; and that we have one thousand copies printed, or so many as the money contributed will pay for.

Resolved, That we tender our thanks to our visiting brethren, who have labored so faithfully to settle the difficulty among our brethren from Liberty.

Resolved, That we tender our thanks to the Moderator and Clerk for their faithful and impartial services; also to the brethren, sisters, and friends in the vicinity, who have, with such Christian friendship and hospitality, entertained us during our present session.

Resolved, That we now adjourn until our next Association in course.
