**I**NTRODUCTORY Sermon by elder Thomas White, from the first verse of the 133 Psalm, "Behold how good, and how pleasant it is, for brethren to dwell together in unity."  Circular letter approved and to be printed with the minutes.  
 Elders James Fishback, Wm. Grinstead, and Richard Morton to preach tomorrow, and elder George Boon to close worship as to him seems good. The association then adjourned till monday morning 9 o'clock.  
 The association met according to adjournment, and after worship proceeded to business, in the order arranged, and reported by the brethren to whom that duty was assigned.  
 Next association to be held at Unity meeting house, in Clarke county, on the fourth Saturday in July 1820.

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Mount Gilead enquires "Is it right for us to commune with a church which is not of the Union, or invite their preachers to our houses, though they are Baptists, they say we follow tradition, and call themselves an independent church."

*Answer.* We think it inconsistent with the terms of general union to commune with persons of such description. But as to inviting their preachers into their houses, the church will act according to her own discretion.

Friendship, requests this association to propose a correspondence with Licking association. Referred till next association, with an expectation that the churches will signify their pleasure on this subject.

Elder John Smith to preach the introductory sermon next association, and in case of failure, elder Samuel Kelly.

Brother James French to prepare a circular letter for next association, and to superintend the printing of the minutes of this association.

## C I R C U L A R .

*Dearly beloved Brethren & Sisters,*

STILL enjoying the happiness to see each others faces in the flesh, and blessed with the privilege of sitting and conferring together, in the solemn capacity of messengers of the churches : O, that it might please Him, who is the head of the body, the church : to vouchsafe that what we write, may be according to the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you, while we mention a few of the many, yea rather of the innumerable good things, which he that is the beginning and the end, the first and the last, has done, is doing, and will do, for all that obey him.

But where shall we begin? or where shall we end? They are longer than the earth, and broader than the sea! Lower than the regions of the dead, and higher than the Heavens! Boundless as immensity, and lasting as eternity! For by him were all things created that are in Heaven, and that are in the earth; visible and invisible: whether they be thrones or dominions, or principalities or powers, all things were created by him, and for him; and he is before all things, and by him all things consist: and he is the head of the body, the church.

The head of the body, the church, sees all the tears and afflictions; hears all the prayers and groans, of his suffering members in all ages and places, and never leaves nor forsakes them; but gives strength equal to the day, and makes them more than conquerors. Not only gives them grace to overcome by the blood of the Lamb; but will also cause the privations and afflictions they suffer for his names sake: to terminate in additional glory: to end in an exceeding great reward. How consolatory, as well as encouraging in the midst of sorrows, is the apostolic inference, for I reckon that our present sufferings are not worthy to be compared with the glory that shall be revealed in us! Well might Peter, and the other apostles rejoice that they were counted worthy to suffer shame for his name. Beloved brethren and sisters, endure hardness as good soldiers of Jesus Christ, for faithful is he that calleth you who also will do it.

The head of the body, the church, is the avenger of all the wrongs and injuries done to his members. And to what a fearful amount, have those wrongs and injuries arisen! For from the time that by faith Abel offered unto God, a more excellent sacrifice than Cain, they who are born after the spirit, are counted as sheep for the slaughter; and as the blood of Abel cryeth, does not all the righteous blood shed

upon earth cry also. And is not the cry of the blood of the poor innocents, in unison with the cry of the souls under the altar. And shall not God avenge his own elect, which cry day and night unto him, though he bear long with them. Our Lord declares that he will avenge them speedily. And the tremendous truth, that vengeance belongeth unto God, and that he will repay, is plainly inculcated by the inspired writers from the time Moses rehearsed the Lord's Song in the ears of all the people, till John was in the spirit on the Lord's day, and heard a great voice of much people in Heaven, saying Alleluia; salvation and glory, and honor, and power, unto the Lord our God: for true and righteous are his judgments: for he hath judged the great whore, which did corrupt the earth with her fornication, and hath avenged the blood of his servants at her hand. Dearly beloved brethren and sisters, avenge not yourselves—to avenge yourselves would be rebellion against the Lord—would be presumptuously to arrogate to yourselves that which belongs to God. Never indulge rancor in your minds against any person: nor yield to the impulses of resentment, however injuriously you may be treated for Christ's sake.

The head of the body, the church, reproves with awful severity, & adjudges to everlasting punishment, those who barely neglect to minister to the necessities of the least of his brethren, & approves, and unspeakably rewards every act of kindness to his destitute sick, or imprisoned saints, not even a cup of cold water escapes his all gracious regards. O, brethren and sisters, to do good, and to communicate forget not, for with such sacrifices God is well pleased. And be not forgetful to entertain strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares. And if it should not be your distinguished lot to entertain angels, you may have the honor and the happiness to entertain some for whom Christ died. To entertain some that the king will acknowledge, in presence of all the holy angels, was done to himself. And never, never forget, who it is that hath said, he that receiveth you receiveth me, and he that receiveth me receiveth him that sent me. When, therefore, you receive a disciple of our Lord, you also receive a greater than angels! you receive him whom all the angels of God worship!

The head of the body, the church, loved the church, and gave himself for it; and we leave it with our beloved brethren and sisters to determine whether eternity itself will be long enough to recount all the good things which the head of the body the church, has done, is doing, and will do for the members of his body, of his bones, and of his flesh. O, the depth of the riches, both of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgments, and his ways past finding out! Amen.
