

Featured Speaker

Dr. Walter C. Jackson, III is Senior Professor of Pastoral Care at The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. He also serves as Assistant Director of the St. Matthews Pastoral Counseling Center.

As Director of Supervised Ministry Experience from 1982-1996, Walter Jackson built the current program of Supervised Ministry at The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. During his directorship, he also served Southern Seminary as an Associate Dean in the School of Theology and a Professor of Ministry Studies. He was named to the Lawrence and Charlotte Hoover Chair in 1995.

Prior to serving on Southern's faculty, Walter Jackson was director of Pastoral Care for the Baptist Medical Center of Oklahoma. Before going to Oklahoma, he served for thirteen years as Chaplain of the Kentucky Baptist Hospital in Louisville. He established accredited CPE Centers in both Oklahoma City and Louisville. He has also served as Pastor to three Kentucky churches.

Walter Jackson is a CPE Supervisor, Diplomat of the American Association of Pastoral Counselors and a Clinical Member and Approved Supervisor of the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy. He was recently certified by the Kentucky Board of Certification of Marriage and Family Therapists. Numerous articles by Walter Jackson appear in denominational periodicals and professional journals. He is the author of *Codependence and the Christian Faith* (Broadman Press, 1990) and co-editor of *Preparing for Christian Ministry: An Evangelical Approach* (Victor Books, 1996).

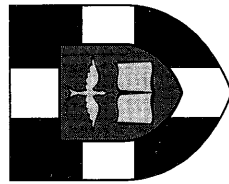

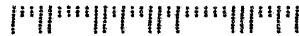
